Fees and Charges

The Division Superintendent shall present a fee and charge schedule to the School Board for approval. The fee and charge schedule, which is posted prior to the school year, shall be designed to meet the needs of the school program and optional course selection. A reduction or waiver of fees will be considered under circumstances as outlined in Policy 4.300. An application for such waiver may be obtained from the school.
