This zany comedy finds the members of the newly renovated Meadowbrook Health Resort in crisis as resort members are dropping like flies. Within moments of the opening, Henry Meadowbrook, the former owner of the resort, played by Ricky Smith, is discovered shot to death. When even the famous chef *Edith Chiles* played by Mikaela Hadly bites the dust, suspicions mount. As Meadowbrook Health Resort is about to launch its grand re-opening the news of the deaths of Henry Meadowbrook and Edith Chiles aren’t the best way to market the place!

Resort manager, John Stone, played by Michael Griffith, becomes detective and desperately searches for the person responsible, a.k.a., *the murderer!* John Stone has a wonderfully sarcastic sense of humor with a dash of cynicism put in to round him out. Stone teams up with Ed Parlor, amateur sleuth and mystery writer, played by Mr. Joe Morris, faculty member and WMHS’s 2012 teacher of the year!
