On Wednesday, 2/19, we will have the Teacher Appreciation Breakfast to thank

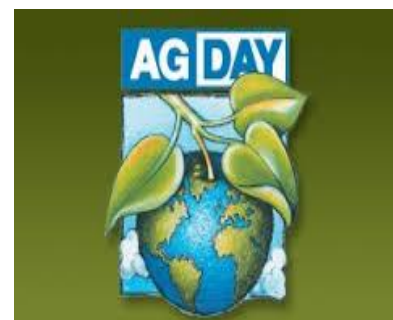

The scholarship forms are in the School Counseling Office lobby in the filing cabinet near Mrs. Landes' desk. If you have any questions or concerns, please see your counselor. Wilson Memorial High School Scholarship Application

WMHS administers several scholarships. Recipients of these scholarships are chosen exclusively from among our WMHS seniors. One application places a student in consideration for all the scholarships.

The applications are located in the School Counseling Office and via the WMHS webpage under the School Counseling tab. Deadline for completion of this application is Friday, 4/25. No late applications will be accepted!

College Information

There are several things to be aware of during the spring semester of your junior year and going forward as you approach senior year. Please plan to take the ACT and/or SAT sometime this Spring or early Summer. If needed, a re-take can occur at the beginning of your senior year. Information about testing dates and times can be found on the School Counseling Webpage. Also, more and more colleges are requesting standardized test scores be sent directly from the testing institution. Please send the scores directly from ACT or SAT to your desired college choices. This can be set up when registering online at collegeboard.org or actstudent.org. This will not only save you time, but also money!!

This is also an excellent time to start planning college visits. You should start narrowing your list of college choices to around five schools. (You have started to think about this – right????) Make a list of questions to ask while on your visit and keep a chart comparing the pros and cons of each college. Things to consider on your visit:

- Call or register online with the college to take the official general tour
- Visit classes – specifically something in your intended major
- Talk with several students
- Eat on campus.
- Grab a student newspaper and read the bulletin boards
- Talk to an advisor or admissions counselor
- Take pictures and notes
- Explore on your own

The play has hilarious complications when Mildred falls in love with Corliss' brother, Lieutenant Lenny Archer played by Josh Stewart.

Directed by Mr. Stephen Winslow, show dates are: Friday, 4/25 and Saturday, 4/26 at 7:00 PM in the Wilson Memorial High School Auditorium. Admission is \$10.00 for Reserved Seating, \$8.00 for General Admission and \$5.00 for Children under 12 and Wilson Memorial High School students.

The two are secretly married and while Lenny is away fighting in the war, Mildred learns she is pregnant. What follows is a series of misunderstandings,

wrong assumptions, gossiping, fisticuffs and a series of wonderful characters who add to the bedlam.

Rounding out the cast are: Raymond Pringle played by Joe Evans, Dexter Franklin played by Matt Tiahrt, Private Earhart played by Eric Calvert, Mary Franklin, again double cast by Mackenzie Griffith and Haley Sanders, Bill Franklin played by Zack Tiahrt, and Louise, the Archer's maid, played by Emily Thompson. Also joining the cast will be two faculty members, Mr. Don Biggs who will play Mr. Willard, a house painter and Mr. Joe Morris, who will play lovable Uncle George Archer.

Mark Stauss

Holocaust Survivor to Speak with Ninth Graders and Community

Mark Strauss, a Holocaust survivor, will speak with all ninth graders on Monday, 2/24, during fourth block in the Wilson Memorial High School Auditorium. The Foundation for Holocaust Education Projects, The Polish Jewish Cemeteries Project and the Wilson Memorial High School Drama and English Departments has partnered to present event. Students and the community will have the opportunity to touch history as they witness the events of the Holocaust through Mark Strauss' memories. Ninth graders study the events of the Holocaust as part of their English curriculum as they read *Night* by Elie Wiesel and *The Book Thief* by Markus Zusak.

Mark Strauss' childhood was filled with the happiness of a loving family and

the excitement of growing up in Eastern Europe's metropolitan city of Lemberg (today - Lviv, Ukraine). Nazi occupation changed everything.

Simply because they were Jewish, Mark's family was forced from their home to a ghetto where extreme hunger and brutality quickly became normal. Mark's father was used as a forced laborer and spent his day "breaking rocks," fearing the entire time that his wife and son would be shipped to a concentration camp or killed while he was away. Each morning, he helped them disappear into a hole hoping to find them there when he was able to return, eight to ten hours later. With a secret warning of the ghetto liquidation, a new safe place was desperately needed. Miraculously, Mark was hidden "in plain sight" until Lemberg was liberated over a year later. Mark describes how his Polish Catholic angel, the woman who hid

Mark, did so at great risk of her own safety because helping a Jew meant certain death to herself, her family, and her neighbors if discovered. At an age when young children begin to imagine what they could become when they grow up, young Mark became an eye witness to Nazi brutality and hatred and to the heroism of a woman he did not know.

Of 100,000 Jewish people in his town, nearly 85,000 were killed, including his extended family. Join us to hear Mark's story of love, happiness, hatred, hunger, fear, courage, humanity, and hope. Mark's experiences become lessons for every audience member.

Then at 7:00 PM also on the evening of 2/24, the Wilson Memorial High School Players will join Mark Strauss on the stage as they present the play, *Who Returned My Soul*, a collection of Holocaust survivor
