

Compound Verb PParts**nōmen:**

This is a list of some of Latin's most important verbs and their **principal parts**. When we put prefixes on them, we call them **compound verbs**. If you learn the principal parts of the main verb now, it will really save you time later!

*Remember almost all 1st conjugation verbs go: -ō, -āre, -āvī, -ātus!

THE MOST IMPORTANT ONE: sum, esse, fuī, futūrus *to be*

faciō, facere, fēcī, factus *to do, make*
-ficiō, -ficere, -fēcī, -fectus e.g. conficiō, conficere, confēcī, confectus *finish*

ferō, ferre, tulī, lātus *to bring, bear, carry*
-ferō, -ferre, -tulī, -latus e.g. offerō, offerre, obtulī, oblātus *offer*

capiō, capere, cēpī, captus *to take, seize, capture*
-cipiō, -cipere, -cēpī, -ceptus e.g. recipiō, recipere, recēpī, receptus *receive*

II

dūcō, dūcere, dūxī, dūctus *to lead, bring*
-dūcō, -dūcere, -dūxī, -dūctus e.g. dēducō, dēducere *escort*

mittō, mittere, mīsī, missus *to send*
-mittō, -mittere, -mīsī, -missus e.g. prōmittō, prōmittere *promise*

videō, vidēre, vīdī, vīsus *to see*
-videō, -vidēre, -vīdī, -vīsus e.g. prōvideō, prōvidēre *foresee, predict*

III

-spiciō, -spicere, -spexī, -spectus *[to look]
e.g. īnspiciō, īnspicere *inspect, look at*

eō, īre, īī, ītus *to go*
-eō, -īre, -īī, -ītus e.g. exeō, exīre *leave, go out*

veniō, venīre, vēnī, ventus *to come*
-veniō, -venīre, -vēnī, -ventus e.g. adveniō, advenīre *arrive, reach*

scrībō, scrībere, scrīpsī, scrīptus *to write*
-scrībō, -scrībere, -scrīpsī, -scrīptus e.g. perscrībō, perscrībere *write out (in full)*

pōnō, pōnere, posuī, positus *to put, place*
-pōnō, -pōnere, -posuī, -positus e.g. dēpōnō, dēpōnere *put down, deposit*

vincō, vincere, vīcī, victus *to conquer*
-vincō, -vincere, -vīcī, -victus e.g. convincō, convincere *convict*

V

cadō, cadere, cecidī, cāsus -cidō, -cidere, -cidī, -cāsus	<i>to fall</i> e.g. incidō, incidere	<i>fall (in), meet</i>
caedō, caedere, cecidī, caesus -cidō, -cidere, -cidī, -cīsus	<i>to kill</i> e.g. occidō, occidere	<i>kill (off)</i>
cēdō, cēdere, cessī, cessus -cēdō, -cēdere, -cessī, -cessus	<i>to give in, yield</i> e.g. prōcēdō, prōcēdere	<i>proceed</i>

VI

agō, agere, ēgī, actus -igō, -igere, -ēgī, -actus	<i>to do, act, behave</i> e.g. redigō, redigere	<i>push back</i>
currō, currere, cucurrī, cursus -currō, -currere, -currī, -cursus	<i>to run</i> e.g. occurrō, occurrere	<i>meet</i>
trahō, trahere, traxī, tractus -trahō, -trahere, -traxī, -tractus	<i>to pull, drag</i> e.g. extrahō, extrahere	<i>pull out</i>

VII

legō, legere, lēgī, lectus -ligō, -ligere, -lēgī, -lectus	<i>to read</i> e.g. eligō, eligere	<i>pick, choose</i>
iaciō, iacere, iēcī, iactus -iciō, -icere, -iēcī, -iectus	<i>to throw</i> e.g. deiciō, deicere	<i>throw down</i>
-gredior, -gredī, -gressus sum	*[to go] e.g. ingredior, ingredi	<i>enter</i>
sequor, sequī, secūtus sum -sequor, -sequī, -secūtus sum	<i>to follow</i> e.g. persequor, persequī	<i>pursue</i>
