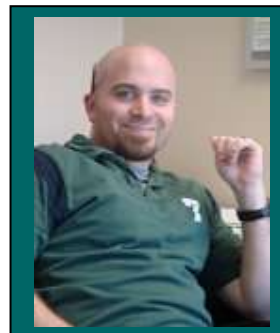

1. District Chorus

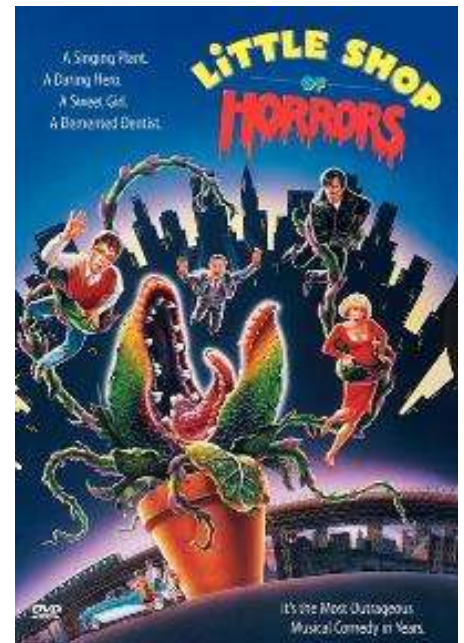
Congratulations to Andrew Fauber, Tori Leche, Aaron Smith, and Taylor Thompson for being selected for this ensemble.

Teachers Recognized with Technology Grants

Three WMHS teachers were recognized for the lessons and activities they developed and submitted to the ICARE staff development program.

Jay Singleton, Social Studies, was recognized for using Differentiation, Rubrics, Six Hats, and Technology.

Michelle Hutchens, Math, was recognized for using Differentiation, Stations focusing on Multiple Intelligences, Six Hats and Manipulatives/Games.

Angie Larner, Science, was recognized for the interfacing of Technology into her entire Biology course, as well as, a lesson that highlighted Multiple Intelligences, Six Hats, and the use of Flip Cameras.

All three teachers received technology grants sponsored by the Administrative Team and the Achievement Booster Club which will be used to purchase technology items for their individual classroom needs. Mr. Shifflett and Cory May, ICARE coordinator, presented twelve teacher's lessons/activities to the Achievement Booster Club for review and award selection. Additional Technology grants will be awarded in May.

ICARE continues to showcase teacher-generated lessons and activities on the ICARE webpage. Currently 68% of the faculty has been awarded ICARE I TEACH t-shirts for sharing and contributing lessons/activities. 49% of the faculty has been awarded ICARE Stars for sharing and contributing an additional lesson/activity. 24% of the faculty has been awarded an additional ICARE Star for sharing and contributing three or more lessons/activities.

Teachers continue to embrace the ICARE staff development program by participating in online monthly sessions that focus on such topics as: Tic Tac Toe Choice Boards, Multiple Intelligences, Rubrics, Six Hats, Graphic Organizers, Technology in the Classroom, Manipulatives and Games, RAFT papers, Differentiation, etc. Teachers have at their immediate disposal, the [ICARE webpage](#) that has a wealth of resources and sample lessons which they can access from anywhere in the world.

Medication Policy

Prescription medication is advised to be taken at home. If a prescribed medication must be taken during the school day, then the parent must fill out a Medication Permission Form. The medication can then be dispensed by the school nurse in the clinic. Prescription medication can not be transported on the bus but needs to be brought in by the parent. Aspirin may be carried by a student if it is in the original container, includes only a one-day dosage, and the student has a note form their parent to carry this medication. No medication (not even aspirin) can be shared with anyone else. Failure to adhere to the medication guidelines may result in a violation of the substance abuse policy. {10 day OSS, referral to the discipline committee, must complete a comprehension drug screening, complete a 10 session program at VASAP; and lose all extra curricular privileges for one entire school year.}

Displaying Affection

Holding hands is considered to be an appropriate display of affection; all other forms of physical touching are unacceptable.

Parking

All of the available parking spaces have been assigned and there is a waiting list that students have already signed up for in the office. As a space comes available, the next person on the list with a valid driver's license will be issued a parking decal and permission to use the parking space. Some students have lost this privilege by skipping school or driving erratically. No parking behind the school. Please be careful when driving in order to keep yourself and others safe and remember to wear your seatbelts.

Attendance at Sporting Events

Attendance at sporting events has been good and organized but I ask that we do a little more. You need to talk during the day and schedule a "white out or green out" that also includes the parents. Communication is the key in building our fan base. The student section is slowly growing at events and we want that to continue. We also thank you for staying respectful during the national anthem and taking your hats and hoods off during the presentation.

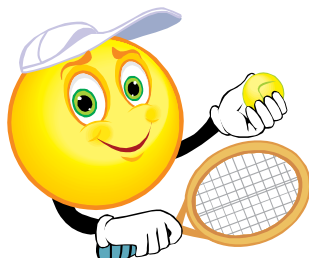
