Theatre Arts Students Rewrite Shakespeare

Ever wonder what it would be like to take on of Shakespeare's classic plays and condense them? Well, Theatre Arts I – III students have taken on the challenge of taking one of Shakespeare's plays and reducing in to 60 seconds. Students began their 60 Second Shakespeare Projects by designing story boards and planning out scenes. Next, using Flip cameras, students began filming adding costume and props. What they came up with is often a blend of slapstick comedy, melodrama, and farce. Caesar's final moments find him ambushed by cowboys and a football player, Romeo and Tybalt fight with light sabers and the shipwreck in the Twelfth Night involves a sink and a toy boat. Finally, using Movie Maker, students added titles, credits, music, sound, and edited their works. It may not have been what Shakespeare was thinking as his ink stained fingers wrote each play, but it was a fun assignment that required creativity and skill to tell the tale of Shakespeare's timeless works.
