For EBSCO the User ID is "s437601", password is "hornets" and for the World Book the user name is "augusta1" and the password is "worldbook". The remaining database, called *Find It Va*, links you to databases supplied by the Library of Virginia and there are no logins or passwords required.

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## A Visit Back In Time

On Friday, 9/16, students in the AP US history and 11AA English class traveled to Colonial Williamsburg. Students visited the 18<sup>th</sup> century living history farm, Great Hopes Plantation, and learned about the lives of slaves on a middling plantation in the Chesapeake region. They enjoyed a tour of the Governor's mansion before visiting the trade shops found throughout the town. AP history students were organized in groups to learn more about specific trades, their economic status within society. These students are creating projects to show what they have learned about the particular citizens and trades while incorporating photographs from their trip.

In the afternoon, the students had a guided tour. We began our journey in the town Courthouse. Judges, Mrs. Carter, Mr. Flippin and David Casey presided over the proceedings. Erica Snook played the role of a widow, whose tobacco crop was ruined during transport under the responsibility of Jimmie Frisbie. Lindsey Baber's responsibility was to call order to the court. Through this participatory activity students were able to learn about the colonial justice system. After this, the group split in two, each following a separate tour guide. Both groups visited trade shops, learned about the role of children in society and visited the Capitol for a tour.

Students read excerpts from famous speeches, such as Patrick Henry's "Give me Liberty, or Give me Death!" that were given in the Capitol (House of Burgesses). They learned about the discussion and process in which Virginia decided to vote to declare independence from Great Britain, under the watchful eyes of King George III. We visited the rooms where the Committee of Correspondence met and discussed political ideas and plans for the colonies and the courtroom in the Capitol, where only men were allowed to sit in front of the bar (hence the phrase "pass the bar"). All students also visited the site of a current archeological dig where they were able to talk to one of the lead archeologists about the dig. We learned they are looking for evidence of a tinsmith shop they know existed. Evidence uncovered in a will has led them to believe it may have rested in this location. Evidence being found during the dig suggests that the term "tinsmith" may have been used as a general term for a metalworks shop.

At the conclusion of our guided tour, students saw part of the street theater performance "Revolutionary City" before heading to dinner. Our last activity of the day was an interactive theater performance held in the Capitol. We attended the performance, "Cry Witch," the trial of a Virginia witch from Princess Ann's County. Some of our students sat on the panel as members of the Governor's Council. The rest of us, as the audience, were the jury. We had opportunities to ask questions and we voted for the guilt or innocence at the conclusion. The trial has been recreated from existing primary source documents such as court records, police records and wills. Since the performance took place in the evening, we sat watching in candlelight.

The experience was worthwhile for all students. 11AA students were able to make several connections to their reading of "The Scarlet Letter," while AP US history students were learning about colonial history and moving toward the revolutionary period. The students asked thought provoking questions of teachers, guides, and each other.

- 🐝 Transcript requests forms and senior autobiography forms (required for counselor recommendations) are available on the WMHS website/Guidance/Forms.
- 🐝 The guidance office needs a minimum FIVE-DAY TURN-AROUND TIME to provide requested information to colleges including transcripts, test scores and a counselor recommendation letter. If the college has a special counselor recommendation form, please submit it to guidance at the time of the transcript request. Also please submit the mid-year report form, if available, at the time of the transcript request.
- 🐝 Additionally, due to the volume of colleges who have application deadlines during the Christmas break or shortly thereafter, the transcript requests and reference requests for all colleges that have a deadline from December 15<sup>th</sup> through January 15<sup>th</sup>, must be turned into the guidance office by December 7<sup>th</sup>. Your attention to these deadlines is greatly appreciated by the guidance office.

## College Visitations:

- 🐝 Absences to visit a college are excused as long as they are prearranged.

## SAT / ACT:

- 🐝 Registration can be done online at [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com) for the SAT and at [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org) for the ACT.
- 🐝 Wilson's school code for both SAT and ACT is 470840.

## Financial Aid:

- 🐝 The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) can be filled out after January 1<sup>st</sup> of your child's senior year. You can get additional information at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov).
- 🐝 Scholarship information will be given out during announcements as well as posted on the webpage and in the guidance office. Applications for some of these scholarships will be available in the guidance office.

## Blue Ridge Community College (BRCC):

- 🐝 A transcript request form must be completed for BRCC.
- 🐝 SAT scores are not required but will be used for placement purposes. If a student has not taken the SAT they can take the placement tests at BRCC.
