ICARE & Technology Staff Development 2010-2011

ICARE & Technology pair up again this year offering a staff development program of choice for teachers. Teachers were able to select their area of focus from a menu of ICARE strategies and activities from differentiation to accommodations, modifications and interventions, and more. Teachers could also elect to select an area of Technology Buffet to focus on for use in the classroom from interactive boards/pads to the use of educational games.

In September, teachers attended workshops. Workshop topics were: "Prezi" a new and totally cool PowerPoint tool

presented by ITRT Mrs. Hinz. Mr. Flippin, ICARE Grant Coordinator, presented a "Show Me the \$\$\$" grant workshop that explained the process of grant writing and grant opportunities that are available. Miss Hutchens presented "Games, Puzzles & Manipulatives:" a workshop that focused on how to use educational games in the classroom across the curriculum.

The ICARE & Technology team plans to offer many opportunities for teachers throughout the year. In addition, teachers will be able to submit lesson plans and activities that showcase ICARE strategies and activities or highlight the use of technology in their classroom which will then make them eligible to receive an ICARE Technology Grant. The administrative team, with the support of the Achievement Booster Club, is able to present a grant each semester. Teachers who submit lessons or activity with also receive an ICARE ~ I TEACH t-shirt.

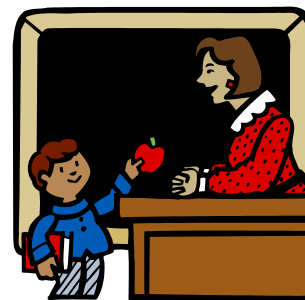

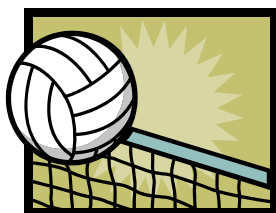
