

## Fresh Florida Strawberry Sell

Everyone loves to see and play on a beautiful, healthy, and safe turf. Here at Wilson we are taking great pride in our facilities and are working hard at making our sports turf fields among the elite in the state of Virginia. In order to make this happen it has and is going to cost money. We are going to need money to purchase equipment and product such as fertilizer, seed, herbicides, pesticides, etc. The equipment and products are being used on the baseball, softball, multi-purpose, and football fields. I know that it seems that every time we turn around that someone is conducting a fundraiser and needing money for this and that. However, I feel that this is a fundraiser that is not used in our area that we could be successful, with your help and the help of anyone else that you may know that could help us sell strawberries.

The strawberries come in a 1 lb quart plastic clam shell container. We will be selling them by the flat (that has 8 containers) for \$25, a half flat (4 containers) for \$14, and by the quart for \$4. The orders will be delivered the week of March 14<sup>th</sup> so it is important that we get the customers phone number so that we can call them as soon as we know day and time of arrival since strawberries are very perishable. Checks can be made out to Wilson High School.


